	The contention of the applicants is that one	
	Arabinda Mridha died on July 9, 2001 while he was	
	working as G.D.A. at Sandelerbil Block Primary Health	
	Centre at Jogeshganj in the District of North 24-Parganas.	
	Arabinda Mridha died leaving behind his wife, Gouri	
	Mridha, son Animesh Mridha and daughter, Madhushree	
	Mridha as legal heirs. The son of the deceased employee	
	submitted application for compassionate appointment	
	which was processed by the Department. During the	
	pendency of the application for compassionate	
	appointment submitted by the son of the deceased	
	employee, the said son, Animesh Mridha approached the	
	Tribunal by filing O.A. 3329 of 2007, which was disposed

	original application to give appointment to Animesh

	within a period of six months after completing all	
	formalities. It appears from letter dated September 14,	
	2017 issued by the Director of Health Services,	
	Government of West Bengal that the present applicant No.	
	1 and Animesh Mridha were requested to furnish	
	information before Chief Medical Officer of Health, North	
	24-Parganas on July 1, 2015 for finalization of	
	appointment of Animesh Mridha. Surprisingly, the	
	mother and the sister of Animesh Mridha decided to give	
	up the claim for compassionate appointment of Animesh	
	Mridha on the ground that Animesh Mridha is living	
	separately and he is not looking after the applicant No.1.	
	The applicant No. 2 being the sister of Animesh Mridha	
	submitted fresh application for compassionate	
	appointment, when the application for compassionate	
	appointment of Animesh Mridha is in the process of	
	finalization. The manner of submission of the application	
	initially by the son of the applicant No. 1 and thereafter,	
	by the daughter of the applicant No. 1 for compassionate	
	appointment, long after the death of the husband of the	
	applicant No. 1, indicates that there was no need of	
	immediate financial crisis in the family of the deceased	
	employee. Had there been acute financial crisis in the	
	family of the deceased employee, the application
