Department, Accountant General (A&E), West Bengal directing her to refund the whole amount of family pension of Rs. 1,396/- (Rupees one thousand three hundred and ninety six only) for the month of August, 2005. The applicant has also prayed for a direction upon the respondents to pay 50% of the family pension to her in terms of the will dated 8th July 1997 executed by her husband. Incidentally, Nishikanta Biswas expired on 20.06.2004.

It appears from the report filed on behalf of the State respondents that late Nishikanta Biswas was first married to Sushila Bala Biswas on 30th November 1958. However, the said marriage was annulled on 1st January, 1963 by a Decree of divorce. Thereafter Nishikanta Biswas married Smritikana Biswas in the year 1964. This was his second marriage. In the instant application, Smritikana Biswas is the private respondent No. 6. During subsistence of the second marriage, late Nishikanta Biswas on 7th December 1978 married the applicant for the third time. Nishikanta Biswas retired on 30th June 1994 and had expired on 20th June, 2004.

Learned Advocate appearing on behalf of the applicant submits that since the applicant is a legally married wife, the order issued by the Indian Audit and Accounts Department, Accountant General (A&E), West

arbitrary and illegal.

grant of probate.

Mr. G.P. Banerjee, Learned Advocate appearing on behalf of the State submits that the third marriage of late Nishikanta Biswas is illegal as the same is not permissible under the provisions of Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 and thus the claim of the applicant cannot be entertained. That apart, assuming the contention on the part of the application is correct, the will on the strength of which she claims 50% of the family pension, cannot be granted as no proceedings have been initiated for

Mr. B. Mitra, Departmenal Representative supports the stand taken by Mr. Banerjee. Mr. S. Halder, learned Advocate appearing on behalf of the private respondent No. 6 submits that as the claim of the applicant has no legal basis, it cannot be upheld. Moreover, since 2006 his client is getting family pension from 2006 in accordance with law. An order directing grant of family pension to the private respondent No.6 is furnished in Court. Let it be kept on the record.

Heard Learned Advocate for the parties and the Departmental Representative. Since Hindu Marriage Act 1955 does not permit marriage during the subsistence of
