Services, Government of West Bengal, but the final decision has not yet been taken by the said respondent no. 4. The grievance of the applicant is that the respondent no. 4 has not yet completed the entire exercise by taking a decision in connection with compassionate appointment of the applicant in spite of lapse of almost 6 (six) years.

None appears on behalf of the state respondents in spite of service of notice as reflected from the Affidavit of service filed on behalf of the applicant.

Having heard Learned Counsel representing the applicant and on consideration of the fact that the respondent no. 4 has not yet taken any decision in connection with compassionate appointment of the applicant, we direct the respondent no. 4, Director of Health Services, Department of Health & Family Welfare, Government of West Bengal to consider the application of the applicant for compassionate appointment in accordance with law and take a decision within a period of 12 (twelve) weeks from the of communication of the order communicate the result of the same to the applicant within a period of 2 (two) weeks thereafter.

With the above direction, the original application is disposed of.
