	respondents for disbursement of retiring gratuity and commuted	
	value of pension of the applicant and for interest @ 8% per	
	annum on the amount of retiring gratuity and commuted value of	
	pension during the period from the date of superannuation of the	
	applicant till the date of actual payment of the said amount.	
	Mr. G.P. Banerjee, Learned Counsel for the applicant,	
	has not pressed for disbursement of the amount of retiring	
	gratuity and commuted value of pension of the applicant on the	
	ground that the applicant has already received the amount of	
	retiring gratuity and commuted value of pension during	
	pendency of the present application on September 12, 2014.	
	The applicant is now claiming only for interest for delayed	
	payment of retiring gratuity and commuted value of pension.	
	None appears on behalf of the state respondents, though	
	the state respondents have filed the reply in the present case.	
	It appears from the materials on record that the applicant	
	retired as Field Labourer on November 30, 2009. It further

appears from record that the applicant has received a sum of Rs.1,09,259/- as retiring gratuity on September 12, 2014 and a sum of Rs.1,85,250/- as commuted value of pension on September 12, 2014. The state respondents have admitted in their reply that delay took place in disbursement of the amount of retiring gratuity and commuted value of pension for issuance of authorisation in favour of another Field Labourer inadvertently and by mistake, which was subsequently corrected and proper authorisation was made by the authority concerned for disbursement of retiring gratuity and commuted value of pension in favour of the applicant. It has, thus, been established from the materials on record that the delay in disbursement of retiring gratuity and commuted value of pension took place due to lapses on the part of the state respondents and as such the applicant is entitled to get interest for delayed payment of retiring gratuity and commuted value of pension.

On consideration of interest paid on long term fixed deposit by the nationalised bank and the interest paid for GPF and PPF, we are of the view that the applicant is entitled to get interest @ 8% per annum. The applicant retired from service on November 30, 2009 and a reasonable period of three months must be given to the state respondents for disbursement of the amount of retiring gratuity and commuted value of pension. Accordingly, the applicant is entitled to get interest during the period from March 1, 2010 till August 31, 2014 i.e. the last date
