SCN.	<p>compassionate appointment by passing a reasoned order within a period of four months from the date of communication of the said order. The reasoned order has been passed by the respondent No. 2 on June 25, 2012. The applicant has challenged the said reasoned order by which prayer of the applicant for compassionate appointment was rejected.</p> <p>Having heard Learned Counsel representing both parties and on consideration of the reasoned order passed by the respondent No. 2, we find that the father of the applicant late Ananta Kumar Bose was Group "D" employee of ex-management staff before taking over of Calcutta National Medical College &amp; Hospital by Government of West Bengal. The father of the applicant never exercised option to come under the control of Government of West Bengal and he was not absorbed in regular government service before his retirement and as such, the question of giving compassionate appointment to the applicant does not arise.
