on April 11, 2011, i.e. long after 10 years of death of his father. In the absence of submission of any application for compassionate appointment immediately after death of the father of the applicant, we are constrained to hold that there was no acute financial crisis in the family the deceased employee warranting compassionate appointment of any of the dependent of the deceased employee. Moreover, the present original application is filed on February 16, 2017 and the last representation with regard compassionate to appointment was submitted by the applicant on April 11, 2015. The applicant should have approached the Tribunal after lapse of 6 (six) months from submission

In view of our above findings, the present application has no merit and the present application is also barred under section 21 of the Administrative Tribunals Act, 1985. So, the original application is dismissed.
