	The applicant joined in the post of Deep Tubewell	
	Operator under the Department of Agri-Irrigation,	
	Government of West Bengal on August 24, 1973. The	
	contention of the applicant is that he retired from	
	service on March 31, 2009, but pension and other	
	retirement benefits have not been released in favour of	
	the application. On consideration of the report	
	submitted by the respondent no. 6 on April 29, 2015,	
	we find that the applicant served in various capacity	
	from August 24, 1973 to November 30, 2000 when he	
	was released from his assignment in Arambagh	
	Development Block on November 30, 2000, and he	
	joined in the office of the respondent no. 6 on December	
	1, 2000. The report indicates that the service of the	
	applicant was not verified in the Service Book from	
	April 1, 1993 onwards and pay scale of the applicant	
	was also not revised for non-submission of option form	
	under ROPA, 1998. Since the applicant has retired	
	from service on March 31, 2009 and since pension and	
	retirement benefits have not been released in favour of

the applicant till date, we are of the view that it is the duty of the Pension Sanctioning Authority to take a decision about entitlement of the applicant to get pension and other retirement benefits and to pass an order in this regard without further delay. pertinent to point out that the applicant was absent intermittently without from duty praying regularisation of the said absence by grant of leave. Accordingly, the Pension Sanctioning Authority will take into account the continuous period of service of the applicant from the date of joining till the date for which absence of the applicant may be regularised by grant of leave for the purpose of pension and other retirement benefits.

Having heard Learned Counsel representing both parties and the authorised representative of the AG (A&E), West Bengal, we direct the applicant to submit a representation before the respondent no. 6 for regularisation of the period of absence within a period of 4 (four) weeks from this date, so that the respondent no. 6 can take a decision for regularisation of absence of the applicant in accordance with provisions of WBSR Part-I. Similarly, the respondent no. 6, Block Development Officer, Goghat-II is directed to consider the representation, if any, submitted by the applicant and to take a decision about entitlement of the applicant to get pension and other retirement benefits by passing a reasoned order within a period 16 (sixteen)
