There are 38 Medical Officers as applicants in OA No. 260 of 2018, 1 Medical Officer as applicant in OA No. 279 of 2018, 6 Medical Officers as applicants in OA No. 292 of 2018, 1 Medical Officer as applicant in OA No. 303 of 2018, 50 Medical Officers as applicants in OA No. 306 of 2018, 1 Medical Officer as applicant in OA No. 307 of 2018, 1 Medical Officer as applicant in OA No. 323 of 2018, 5 Medical Officers as applicants in OA No. 329 of 2018, 1 Medical Officer as applicant in OA No. 338 of 2018 and 1 Medical Officer as applicant in OA No. 361 of 2018. All the above 105 applicants were granted NOC by the respondent no. 3 for participating in the counselling for admission to PG Courses, but Sponsorship Certificate was not issued to them for their placement on Trainee Reserve. While temporary NOC was issued to 364 Medical Officers for participating in the counselling for admission to PG Course, the respondent no. 3 restricted the number of Trainee Reserve to 180 for the academic session 2018 by issuing Memo No. HPT/23T-16-18/A1539 dated April 12, 2018 (hereinafter referred to as order dated April 12, 2018). The said order was subsequently modified by the respondent no. 3 by issuing Memo No. HAD/10M-07-18/Pt.-II/M-151 dated April 20, 2018 (hereinafter referred to as order dated April 20, 2018) whereby the number of Trainee Reserve was increased from 180 to 194. Subsequently, the number of

Trainee Reserve was again increased from 194 to 196 by the respondent no. 3 by issuing Memo No. HAD/10M-07-18/Pt.-II/M-152 dated April 21. 2018 (hereinafter referred to as order dated April 21, 2018). The applicants have prayed for quashing the said order dated April 12. 2018, order dated April 20, 2018 and order dated April 21, 2018 issued by the respondent no. 3 and other ancillary reliefs by filing several original applications and by filing supplementary affidavit on the ground that the number of Trainee Reserve was fixed in an arbitrary and whimsical manner without following the provisions of the rules and administrative orders issued in this regard from time to time by the State respondents.

Mr. Pratik Dhar, Learned Senior Counsel appearing on behalf of some of the applicants contends that all the applicants have fulfilled eligibility criteria for placement on Trainee Reserve as Government sponsored candidates. He has made two fold submissions for challenging the orders of fixing the number of Trainee Reserve by the respondent no. 3: first, admission of the applicants in PG Course of the University without obtaining sponsorship certificate was done by the applicants under compulsion and the provisions of the rules in this regard should be treated as directory in nature and secondly, the number of Trainee Reserve must be increased from 196 to 348 by way of mathematical calculation of the existing strength

3 of the service. Mr. Dhar has accepted the number of

existing strength of service disclosed by the State respondents in the reply as 6746 as on December 31, 2017. By referring to Notification dated March 6, 2018 issued by respondent no. 1, he has categorically pointed out that 10% of the existing strength of the service as on December 31, 2017 will be 674. The specific submission on behalf of the applicants is that the numbers of the Medical Officers who joined in 2015, 2016 and 2017 cannot be excluded from the existing strength of the service, particularly when 133 Medical Officers who joined in the service in the year 2015, have already been allowed for provisional admission in PG course as Government sponsored candidates. By deducting the number of Medical Officers placed on Trainee Reserve in the previous year (326), the number of Trainee Reserve for the year of 2018 should be 348. Mr. Dhar has urged us to consider that all the present applicants should come within the ambit of the strength of Trainee Reserve as per merit list even after accommodating 196 candidates who were allowed for admission in PG course as government candidates. Other Learned sponsored Counsels representing other applicants have adopted argument of Mr. Dhar.

the State respondents has referred to the contention made in paragraph 2 of Reply and submitted that the Medical Officers who have joined in the service in 2015, 2016 and 2017 have not completed 3 years of service as yet and as such the posts held by those Medical Officers must be excluded from the existing strength of 6746. He further submits that by excluding the posts held by Medical Officers who have not yet been confirmed in service, the number of existing strength of Medical Officers will be 5061 (6746-1685). According to Mr. Banerjee, 10% of the above existing strength will be 506 and by deducting the number of Medical Officers placed on Trainee Reserve in the previous years (326), the number of Trainee Reserve for the year 2018 will be 180 (506-326). The specific contention of Mr. Banerjee is that the Medical Officers who have not completed three years of service are not eligible to be placed on Trainee Reserve as government sponsored candidates as per provisions of Rule 3(a) (i) of the West Bengal Medical Education Service, the West Bengal Health Service and the West **Public** Health-cum-Administrative Bengal Service (Placement on Trainee Reserve) Rules, 2015 (hereinafter referred to as "The Trainee Reserve Rules of 2015)" and as such the Medical Officers who are not eligible to qualify for placement on Trainee Reserve are to be excluded from the existing strength of service.

The issue to be decided by the Tribunal is whether 105 applicants will be placed on Trainee Reserve as per provisions of the Trainee Reserve Rules, 2015 and the orders issued from time to time in this regard by the State respondents. Admittedly, all the applicants are Medical Officers either under West Bengal Health Service or under West Bengal Public Health-cum-Administrative Service and they have completed 3 years of service. The further admitted position is that the respondent no. 3 issued NOC to all the applicants for participating in the counselling after they were qualified in NEETPG, 2018 conducted by National Board of Examination (NBE). The applicants enrolled themselves for participation in counselling as inservice candidates after receiving NOC from the respondent No. 3. The applicants, thus, fulfilled eligibility criteria for placement on Trainee Reserve as Government sponsored candidates in accordance with the provisions of Rule 3 of the Trainee Reserve Rules of 2015.

Now, the question which calls for determination is whether the applicants are coming within the ambit of number of Trainee Reserves to be fixed by the State respondents. The provisions of Rule 9 of the Trainee Reserve Rules of 2015 has clearly laid down that the placement of any Medical Officer on Trainee Reserve as a Government sponsored candidate is entirely under the discretion of the Department of Health and Family

Welfare, Government of West Bengal. It is well-settled that whenever any discretion is to be exercised by the State, the said discretion must be exercised fairly, reasonably, judiciously and in accordance with well-settled principles of law and not by resorting to the procedure which is arbitrary and illegal. Naturally, we have to consider whether the State respondents have exercised the discretion in fixing the number of Trainee Reserve for the year 2018 fairly, reasonably and in accordance with notifications and orders issued in this regard from time to time.

Both parties have relied on Notification bearing no. HF/O/MA/216/4P-01/17/Pt.I dated March 6, 2018 issued by the respondent no. 1 for the purpose of fixing annual strength of Trainee Reserve. It is relevant to quote the said Notification dated March 6, 2018, which is as follows:

The matter of fixation of annual Trainee Reserve strength in the Department of Health and Family Welfare for WBHS, WBPHAS, WBMES, Dental Service and Dental Education Service was under consideration of the Government for some time past.

- 2. In view of the above, after careful consideration, the Governor is pleased to pass an order for fixation of permissible limit of Post Graduate T.R. every year/academic session for the officers of above mentioned services, in supersession of all previous order/s in this regard.
- 3. Henceforth, strength of Trainee Reserve will be fixed as 10% of existing strength (not sanctioned strength) as on as on 31 st December of previous year. Therefore, for any session/year T.R. will be allowed in order of merit, to 10% of existing strength as on 31st December of previous year.
- 4. Sponsorship certificate for appearing at PG counselling will be issued to specific number of candidates in order of merit. Initially, only temporary NOC will be issued to the NEET qualified candidates to appear for counselling. Such temporary NOC shall in no way be an assurance to the candidate or the admitting College/University that they are being placed as Trainee Reserve. After completion of counselling and offer of discipline, the candidates may be issued departmental sponsorship for such disciplines to be finally considered as Trainee Reserve. It is reiterated that Trainee Reserve may be denied due to administrative reasons in the interest

Any candidate applying for T.R/Study Leave/Extra Ordinary Leave/for second time, availed of such T.R/Study Leave/EOL previously, shall have to mandatorily obtain no objection, even while applying to appear in the qualifying examination through proper channel and appear for such examination only after having permission from appropriate authority.
- 6. Admissibility of Extra Ordinary Leave for study purpose shall be dealt as individual cases as per administrative requirement under the guiding provisions of WBSR but not as trainee reserve.
- 7. This has approval of Finance Department vide their UO No. Group P2/2017-2018/0927 dated 11/01/2018.

On perusal of the above Notification, it appears that the strength of Trainee Reserve for any academic session

will be fixed on the basis of 10% of existing strength (not sanctioned strength) of service as on 31st December of the previous year. The above Notification further indicates that sponsorship certificate will be issued to specific number of candidates in order of merit after completion of counselling and offer of discipline for admission in PG Course. However, temporary NOC will be issued to the candidates who qualified in NEETPG for participating in the counselling. The moot point for determination is what will be the number of Trainee Reserves for the year 2018 on the basis of 10% of existing strength of service. The State respondents have disclosed in the reply that the number of existing strength of service is 6746 as on December 31, 2017. By issuing addendum on April 02, 2018 to the earlier notification issued by the Respondent No.1 on March 6, 2018, the Respondent No.1 has clarified that the total strength of Trainee Reserve for an academic session will be determined by calculating 10% of "permanent duty post" of the existing strength (i.e. men in position) as on 31st December of the previous year. While the previous notification dated March 6, 2018 was issued by the Respondent No.1 by order of the Governor, the addendum was issued for clarification without obtaining any order of the Governor.

Mr. Banerjee, Learned Counsel for the State Respondents has put forward the argument that the

	The existing strength of the Medical Officers is disclosed	
	as 6746 as on December 31, 2017. The Medical Officers	
	who joined in the service temporarily in substantive	
	post/permanent post can never be excluded from the	
	existing strength of service on the ground that those	
	Medical officers have not been confirmed in the service	
	for not completing three years of service. Consequently,	
	Medical Officers who have been appointed temporarily in	
	the permanent post or substantive post of the service can

	Medical Officers who joined in the service in the year

Reserve for the academic session 2018. We do not accept the stand of the State respondents for deducting 1685 posts of Medical Officers from the existing strength of service, as the same is arbitrary and not justified under the law. Accordingly, we would like to consider the existing strength of service as 6746 on December 31, 2017 for the purpose of calculation of the strength of Trainee Reserve for the academic session 2018. 10% of the existing strength of service will be at least 674 (i.e. 10% of the 6746). The State respondents have disclosed in the reply that 326 Medical Officers have already been released on Trainee Reserve in the previous years and they are still undergoing PG courses. Therefore, the strength of Trainee Reserve for the academic session 2018 will be "674 - 326" i.e. 348. The State respondents have already issued orders by declaring the strength of Trainee Reserve as 196. Owing to illegal and arbitrary calculation of the strength of Trainee Reserve the State respondents have deprived 152 Medical Officers of their legitimate right to get admission in PG course as Government sponsored candidates for the academic session 2018.

Now, we would like to decide whether the admission of the applicants in different PG Courses under the University is vitiated for not obtaining Sponsorship Certificate. It is relevant to quote provisions of Rule 5 of the Trainee Reserve Rules of 2015, which is as follows:

	Bengal & Ors. V. Soumya Kundu & Ors.) on May 14,	
	2018.	
	By virtue of the interim order passed by the	
	Tribunal and approved by the Hon'ble High Court, the	
	applicants participated in the second round of counselling	
	and last round of counselling and took admission in PG	
	Courses without obtaining sponsorship certificates. By	
	referring to a flow-chart enclosed with the supplementary	
	affidavit filed by the applicants, Mr. Dhar has pointed out	
	the paucity of time at the disposal of the applicants for	
	getting admission after obtaining sponsorship certificates,	
	particularly when the respondents did not approve	
	issuance of the sponsorship certificates beyond 196	
	Medical Officers who got admission in PG courses as	
	Government sponsored candidates. On perusal of the said	
	flow-chart we find that the applicants had to register for

	round of counselling seat matrix was declared on May 8,	
	2018, seats were allotted on May 9, 2018 and admission	
	date was fixed on May 10, 2018. During mop up	
	counselling seat matrix was declared on May 11, 2018,	
	seats were allotted on May 15, 2018 and dates of	
	admission were closed on May 16, 2018. Since the period	
	of admission after allotment of seats in PG courses was

	schedule can never be modified or disrupted by anyone.				
	Mrs. S. Majumdar, Learned Counsel representing the				
	respondent University has adopted the argument of Mr.				
	Bhattacharya and Mr. Banerjee.				
	Since the applicant got admission in PG courses				
	after participating in the counselling and allotment of seats				
	as Government sponsored candidates, they cannot				
	continue higher education in PG courses without obtaining				
	sponsorship certificate from the concerned respondents.				
	On consideration of the circumstances under which the				
	applicants got admission in PG courses and on perusal of				
	flexibility of the procedure for issuing sponsorship				
	certificates either before admission in PG course under the				
	university or before appearing in the entrance examination				
	conducted by the university as laid down in Rule 5 of				
	Trainee Reserve Rules of 2015, we would like to interpret				
	the words "before admission" appearing in Rule 5 of				
	Trainee Reserve Rules as directory in nature. Had the said				
	provisions been mandatory, the Rules must have				
	prescribed provision for cancellation of the admission of

admission of the said applicants.

It will not be out of place to mention that the under applicants who are working different hospitals/health centres under Department of Health and Family Welfare, Government of West Bengal will discharge their duty again in some other hospitals where they will undergo PG courses. The State respondents will get the benefit of service from the applicants in the hospitals where they will be attached for their PG courses, and they will be bound to execute the bond for working for the Government for a maximum period of three years or two years depending on the duration of PG course, after completion of the said course, in default of which they will have to refund to the Government huge amount of Rs. 10 lakh (Rupees ten lakh only) to Rs. 20 lakh (Rupees twenty lakh only) depending on the duration of the course. The State respondents should not deny the applicants opportunity to continue the PG course as Government sponsored candidates, particularly when they are within the ambit of the number of Trainee Reserve.

In view of the foregoing reasons, we are constrained to hold that order dated April 12, 2018, order dated April 20, 2018 and order dated April 21, 2018 issued by the respondent No. 3, Director of Health Services, West Bengal are quashed. Similarly, the notice

The memo dated March 19, 2018 issued by the Joint Secretary to the Government of West Bengal, Department of Health and Family Welfare, Medical Administration Branch and Addendum dated April 2, 2018 issued by the respondent No. 1, Principal Secretary to the Government of West Bengal, Department of Health and Family Welfare are also quashed. respondent No. 3, Director of Health Services, West Bengal is directed to issue sponsorship certificate in favour of all the applicants along with 196 candidates who have already been allowed to get admission in PG courses as Government sponsored candidates within a period of two weeks from the date of communication of the order. The respondent No. 1, Principal Secretary to the Government of West Bengal, Department of Health and Family Welfare is directed to issue placement order for trainee reserve in favour of all the applicants along with 196 candidates referred to above for continuation of their PG courses under the university within a period of two weeks from the date of communication of the order. With directions the above all original applications are disposed of. The urgent xerox certified copy of the order, if
