Agarwal, Learned Advocate.</p> <p>The applicant has prayed for direction upon the respondents to grant family pension.</p> <p>It appears from the materials on record that one Tarapada Hore retired from Government service on February 28, 1995 after rendering service for almost 36 years. Tarapada Hore received pension in due course after retirement and ultimately died on August 10, 2014. Tarapada Hore declared before the Pension Sanctioning Authority that he has no family and as such he nominated his nephews for the purpose of receiving life-time arrears of pension and other retirement benefits in case of his death.</p> <p>The present applicant claiming to be the wife of Tarapada Hore has produced copy of Aadhaar Card and copy of Voter Identity Card to establish that the applicant is the legally married wife of the deceased Tarapada Hore. Both these documents were procured by the applicant almost after two years of death of Tarapada Hore. There is nothing on record to indicate that</p>

the applicant is the legally married wife of deceased Tarapada Hore. Even the applicant has failed to disclose the date and month of her alleged marriage with the deceased Tarapada Hore. The applicant claims that she gave birth of three sons and one daughter from her wedlock with the deceased Tarapada Hore. No document like birth certificate or school leaving certificate is forthcoming before us to establish that the deceased Tarapada Hore was the father of three sons and one daughter of the applicant.

In view of our above observation, we cannot persuade ourselves to accept the claim of the applicant that she is the legally married wife of the deceased Tarapada Hore for the purpose of grant of family pension. The applicant is not entitled to get any relief in the present application. As a result, the present application is **dismissed**.
