	The applicants have prayed for quashing of the order communicated to the applicant No. 2 by the	
	respondent No. 3 on October 19, 2016 (Annexure "A-10"	
	to the original application) and other ancillary reliefs.	
	The contention of the applicants is that one	
	Bisheshar Tiwari died on March 20, 2005 while he was	
	working as Constable under Muchipara Police Station in	
	Kolkata. Bisheshar Tiwari died while in service leaving	
	behind the applicant No. 1 as his wife, one Shaktinath	
	Tiwari as his elder son, one Mira Devi as his daughter and	
	the applicant No. 2 as his younger son. The further	
	contention of the applicants is that the applicant No. 2	
	was about 12 years old at the time of death of his father.	
	He submitted application for compassionate appointment	
	on attaining majority. The applicant No. 2 participated in	
	the physical measurement test for being enrolled as a	
	candidate for exempted category for appointment in the

	post of Constable. Ultimately, on October 19, 2016 the	
	respondent No. 3 communicated to the applicant that his	
	case for appointment under exempted category is rejected	
	on the basis of guidelines contained in the notification No.	
	251-Emp dated December 3, 2013 issued by the Labour	
	Department, Government of West Bengal.	
	Learned Counsel for the applicant contends that the	
	Labour Department Notification dated December 3, 2013	
	is not applicable in case of appointment of the applicant	
	No. 2 on compassionate ground. He further submits that	
	the elder brother of the applicant No. 2 was 22 years old at	
	the time of death of his father, but he is self-employed for	
	doing work of agriculture in the landed property and he is	
	living separately and as such, he did not submit any	
	application for compassionate appointment. On the other	
	hand, Learned Counsel representing the State respondents	
	has produced statement of facts from the respondent No. 3	
	and submitted that there was no immediate need of	
	employment in the family of the deceased employee after	
	the death of Bisheshar Tiwari and as such, the application	
	of the applicant No. 2 for compassionate appointment was	
	rejected.

	Having heard Learned Counsel representing both		
	parties and on consideration of the facts of the present		
	case, we find that the elder son of the deceased employee		
	was 22 years old at the time of death of Bisheshar Tiwari.		
	Had there been acute financial crisis in the family of the		
	deceased employee, the elder son of the deceased		
	employee being eligible to get the appointment on		
	compassionate ground, would have filed application		
	praying for compassionate appointment. In the absence of		
	filing of an application by the elder son of the deceased		
	employee for compassionate appointment, we find		
	justification in rejection of prayer of the applicant No. 2		
	by the respondent No. 3. We are unable to accept the		
	contention made on behalf of the applicant that the elder		
	son of the deceased employee is living separately and		
	employed in the agricultural work in the landed property,		
	as no cogent evidence in this regard is placed on behalf of		
	the applicant. Even if we take for argument's sake that		
	the case of the applicant No. 2 will not be governed by		
	Labour Department notification dated December 3, 2013,		
	the case of the applicant for compassionate appointment		
	cannot be considered on the basis of other notifications of		
	the Labour Department, Government of West Bengal		
	which were in force at the time of death of father of the
