	It has been stated that the applicant was	
	appointed as a D.D.T. Spray Worker in 1975 under the	
	Chief Medical Officer of Health, Paschim Midnapore and	
	had served for 25 years along with other workers who	
	were similarly situated. During his employment, he was	
	getting salary which was subsequently enhanced to the	
	level which all permanent Group "D' workers were	
	drawing. We find from the application that the applicant	
	had filed Original Application, being O.A. 7024 of 1998,	
	praying for certain reliefs which was dismissed on 29 th

	June, 1999. Dissatisfied, the applicant filed writ petition,	
	being W.P.S.T. No. 453 of 1999, which was also	
	dismissed. Thereafter the applicant moved the Hon'ble	
	Supreme Court. The Supreme Court, in S.L.P. (C) No.	
	1596 of 2001, issued notice upon the respondents and	
	directed maintenance of status quo which was	
	subsequently extended till the disposal of all similar	
	pending appeals. It has been alleged in the application	
	that the respondents without following the order of the	
	Supreme Court had adopted a pick and choose policy and	
	appointed certain persons except the applicant. Thereafter	
	it appears that the applicant had filed a title suit, being No.	
	T.S. 99 of 2009 @ (CIS. Reg. No. 3613 of 2014) in the	
	year 2009 praying for the following reliefs :	
	"(a) That it be declared that the	
	plaintiff will be entitled to join the job as	
	Group "D" Category under the C.M.O.H.,	
	Medinipore and further be declared that the	
	plaintiff is below the sixty years of age	
	declaring the date of birth is 11/11/1949.	
	(b) That the defendants be restricted	
	by an order of injunction from disturbing the	
	plaintiff from his service as a permanent staff	
	as Group "D" within an order of mandatory	
	injunction directing the defendants to issue	
	the joining letter so the plaintiff to join the	
	service for the post.

	(c) That the plaintiff be entitled to	
	get cost of the suit;	
	(d) That the plaintiff be granted such	
	other relief or reliefs as he may in law and	
	equity be entitled to;"	
	It appears that the said title suit was disposed of	
	on 27 th November, 2017 by passing a judgement and order	
	the relevant portion of which is as under.	
	"that the suit be and the	
	same is decreed contest against the	
	defendants without any cost.	
	It is hereby declared that the	
	plaintiffs date of birth is 11-11-1949.	
	And it is further declared that the	
	plaintiff was entitled to join as Group	
	D category under the CMOH,	
	Midnapore."	
	It is submitted by Mr. S. Bhattacharjya, learned	
	advocate for the applicant that since it has been declared	
	by the civil court that the plaintiff's date of birth is 11 th	
	November, 1949, and as it has been declared that the	
	plaintiff was entitled to join in the Group D category, and	
	when other similarly situated persons have got the benefits	
	and as on the date of filing the suit, he was within the age	
	of 60 years, orders be issued for consideration of the

	Mr. S. Ghosh, learned advocate appearing on	
	behalf of the State respondents submits that in view of the	
	provisions contained in Section 15 of the Administrative	
	Tribunals Act, 1985, civil Court has no jurisdiction to	
	declare that the plaintiff is entitled to be appointed under	
	Group "D" category under the C.M.O.H., Midnapore.	
	Moreover as the cause of action, if at all, arose in the year	
	2009, it is hit by Section 21 of the 1985 Act.	
	Heard Mr. Bhattacharjya and Mr. Ghosh.	
	Section 15 of the 1985 Act, inter alia, postulates that the	
	Tribunal shall exercise, on and from the appointed day, all	
	the jurisdiction, powers and authority exercisable	
	immediately before that day by all Courts (except the	
	Supreme Court) in relation to -recruitment, and matters	
	concerning recruitment, to any civil service of the State or	
	to any civil post under the State. In West Bengal, the	
	West Bengal Administrative Tribunal is functioning since	
	1995.	
	In the instant case, as the appointment is with	
	regard to a civil post under the State, in our view, the	
	Learned Civil Judge (Jr. Division), 3 rd Court, Paschim	
	Medinipore, had no jurisdiction to declare that the plaintiff

	is entitled to join as Group D category under the Chief	
	Medical Officer of Health, Midnapore. That apart as the	
	West Bengal State Administrative Tribunal has been	
	exercising its jurisdiction since 1995, and as the cause of	
	action, if any, arose in 2009, it is hit by Section 21 of the	
	1985 Act which prescribes the period of limitation. In	
	view of the peculiar facts and circumstances of the case,	
	we have dealt not only on the point of limitation, but also	
	on the point whether the Civil Court has the jurisdiction to	
	entertain an application with regard to appointment to a	
	civil post under the State. Hence, for the reasons as	
SCN.	aforesaid, the application is dismissed.
