	<p>applicant is entitled to pension. Submission is though a representation dated 23<sup>rd</sup> December, 2018 was furnished before the authorities, it has not been considered. Aggrieved, this application has been filed.</p> <p>Mr. A. Datta, the Departmental Representative of the respondents submits that since the applicant had performed the duties of casual worker / Tahasil Mohury from 1975 to 1984 and thereafter after being absorbed as a Group 'D' staff in the government establishment had worked from 29<sup>th</sup> December, 2000 to 31<sup>st</sup> July, 2004, when he superannuated and since he has worked for more than four years, he is not entitled to pension.</p> <p>Heard Mr.U.K.Bhattacharya, learned advocate for the applicant and Mr.A.Datta, the Departmental representative.</p> <p>Having heard learned advocate for the applicant and the Departmental Representative for the respondents and considering the fact that the issue regarding grant of pension to the applicant is yet to be disposed of, considering the facts and circumstances of the case, the application is disposed of by granting liberty to the applicant to file a representation afresh ventilating his grievances before the Additional District Magistrate and District Land and Land Reforms Officer, Paschim Medinipur, the respondent no. 2(e), within eight weeks from the date of obtaining a copy of this order.
