Banerjee, Learned Advocate.</p> <p>The applicant has prayed for direction upon the respondents to issue appointment letter in favour of the applicant on compassionate ground.</p> <p>It appears from the materials on record that one Geeta Devi, Female GDA attached to NRS Medical College and Hospital died on October 7, 2012 leaving behind the applicant as her son and the private respondent no. 5 as her daughter. The contention of the applicant is that the father of the applicant pre-deceased the mother of the applicant. On June 12, 2013 the applicant submitted application for compassionate appointment in the prescribed format. It appears from the supplementary application filed by the applicant that on October 14, 2014, the respondent no. 5 also submitted application for compassionate appointment. During the pendency of the present application, the respondent no. 2 issued one letter in favour of the applicant on August 30, 2016, whereby the said respondent intimated the applicant that his</p>

application for compassionate appointment cannot be forwarded on two grounds : (i) that the application in prescribed format is incomplete and (ii) no objection has not been furnished from respondent no. 5 who happens to be the sister of the applicant.

Having heard Learned Counsel representing both parties and on consideration of the facts and circumstances of the present case, we cannot persuade ourselves to give any direction to the respondents in connection with the compassionate appointment of the applicant, as the applicant has not furnished no objection from the sister and as the application in prescribed format was incomplete. The applicant is at liberty to proceed further by submitting complete application in the prescribed format and by submitting no objection from the respondent no. 5 as required for processing the prayer of the application for compassionate appointment.

With the above observation, the original application is disposed of.
