	Having heard Learned Counsel for the applicant,	
	Learned Counsel for the State respondent, Learned	
	Counsel for the private respondent No. 6 and the	
	authorised representative of respondent, A.G., West	
	Bengal, we are of the view that the claim of the applicant	
	should be considered and decided by the pension	
	sanctioning authority in accordance with the provisions of	
	law. Note to Rule 104 of West Bengal Services (Death-	
	cum-Retirement Benefit) Rules 1971 provides that when a	
	Government servant is survived by more than one widow,	
	family pension shall be paid to them in equal shares. This	
	provision further lays down that on death of a widow her	
	share of the pension shall become payable to her eligible	
	minor children. However, if at the time of her death a	
	widow leaves no eligible minor child, the payment of her	
	share of the pension shall cease. Accordingly, we direct	
	the respondent No. 3, Joint Commissioner of Police	
	(Intelligence), Special Branch, Kolkata to decide the	
	entitlement of the applicant No. 1 to get family pension	
	along with respondent No. 6 in accordance with the	
	provisions of Note to Rule 104 of West Bengal Services	
	(Death-cum-Retirement Benefit) Rules 1971 after giving	
	the applicant No. 1 and the respondent No. 6 opportunity
