The matter is taken up by the Single Bench pursuant to the Notification No. 949-WBAT/2J-15/2016 dated 24.12.2020 issued in exercise of the power conferred under Sub-Section (6) of Section 5 of the Administrative Tribunal Act, 1985.

The applicant has filed this application praying for the following relief :-

- a) Order/orders be passed directing the respondent authorities concerned to grant benefits stipulated in the circulars being Memo No. 9008-F(P) Kolkata, dated 16.09.2011, Memo No. 1107-F(P), Howrah dated 25.02.2016 and other related circulars issued by the Government extending the benefits to the Daily Rated/Casual/ Contractual employees of the West Bengal including the applicant.
- b) Order/orders be passed directing the respondent authorities concerned to grant the benefits stipulated in the circulars being Memo No. 9008-F(P), Kolkata dated 16.09.2011, Memo 1107-F(P),

Howrah dated 25.02.2016 following the Memo No. 399 BF (P2) dated 15.07.2019 and other related circulars issued by the Government holding that the applicant is a casual worker and is entitled to have the entire benefits as mentioned in Memo No. 9008-F(P) dated 16.09.2011, 25.02.2016, 15.07.2019 and other related memos/circulars issued by the Govt.

- c) Order/orders be passed as the Hon'ble Tribunal may deem fit and proper by considering the similiary situated persons as reliefs granted to the other employee in view of the orders passed by the Learned Tribunal dated 26.08.2018 in OA-579 of 2018 and order dated 19.08.2019 in OA-77 of 2019 respectively.

As per the applicant, he is working as daily rated casual worker for more than ten years.

During the course of hearing the counsel for the applicant has submitted that he wants to make a comprehensive representation before the Respondent No. 2, Principal Secretary, Fire & Emergency Services for extension of benefit of circulars as mentioned in the instant application treating the application as a part of the said representation and to take a final decision by way of a reasoned and speaking order within a stipulated period of time.

The counsel for the respondent has no objection to such proposition.
