The matter is taken up by the Single Bench pursuant to the order contained in the Notification No. 638-WBAT/2J-15/2016 (Pt.-II) dated 23rd November, 2022 issued in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 5 (6) of the Administrative Tribunals Act, 1985.

On consent of the learned counsels for the contesting parties, the case is taken up for consideration sitting singly.

The two fold prayers in this application are as follows: (i) Payment of enhanced remuneration as per Notification No. 9008 and (ii) an order regularizing his services,

At the very outset, it is hazy as to what post the applicant has been engaged. Somewhere from his application, it appears that he is a Date Entry Operator engaged on contractual basis, but from the reasoned order passed on 02.08.2023, he has been shown as additional housekeeping and scavenging personnel. The Tribunal fails to see any relationship between these two extreme types of designation. It is also clear that whatever post he has held, was not against any sanctioned post, nor such post was given after approval of the competent authorities. Further to add more confusion, Mr.Roy has indicated that the applicant has been engaged not directly, but through an agency. Therefore, his services are through the agency and the respondent authorities has no responsibility for his service related welfare measures.
