The matter is taken up by the single Bench pursuant to the order contained in the Notification No.496-WBAT / 1E-08/2003 (Pt.-II) dated 4th August, 2022 issued in exercise of the powers conferred under section 6(5) of the Administrative Tribunals Act, 1985.

In this application, Smt. Madhabi Chanda (Das), the applicant has prayed for certain reliefs, the relevant portion of which is as under:

- “(a) An order directing the respondent authority to pay the arrear dues to the applicant with interest as entitled in law.*
- (b) An order directing the respondent authorities more particularly the Respondent No.2 to dispose of the applicant dated 21.01.2019 without any further delay and to pass necessary order as which is entitled under the law;*
- (c) An order directing the respondent authorities to dispose of the application without any delay and to pass necessary order and to pay terminal benefits as entitled in law.”*

It is submitted by Mr. Chandra Sekhar Bag, learned advocate for the applicant that for the ends of justice, the respondents may be directed to dispose of the representation dated 22nd January, 2019 addressed to the Deputy Inspector
