In the application, Tapan Kumar Kar, the applicant who was appointed in the post of Sub-Registrar on 19th June, 1996 under the Inspector General of Registration and Commissioner of Stamp Revenue, Government of West Bengal on temporary basis and confirmed on 28th September, 2001 and subsequently promoted and at present District Registrar in the district of Paschim Medinipore with effect from 7th April, 2017, has prayed for several reliefs, the relevant portion of which is as under:

- "a) To direct the concerned respondents, more particularly the respondent no. 2 to release the 16 years' service benefits to the applicant in strict compliance of the notification issued by the Government of West Bengal time to time, forthwith;
- b) To direct the concerned respondents, more specifically the respondent no. 2, to pay the entire arrear amount due to the applicant upon granting him the benefits of completion 16 years' service, with effect from, 28.09.2017, till the date of actual payment, along with the interest accrued therein, forthwith;"

The grievance of the applicant is though after completion of 8 years of permanent service he has been granted service benefits, that is, CAS, with effect from 28th September, 2009, in the pay band scale no. 4 as per the Directorate's notification/circular dated 13th September, 2010, however, even after completion of 16 years of service he is yet to be granted MCA benefit of the next pay band. Submission is though representation dated 24th August, 2020 was submitted before the OSD & Ex-Offcio Secretary, Finance Department and the Inspector General and Registration and Commissioner of Stamp Revenue, West Bengal the respondent no. 2, whereby it was pointed out that juniors to him have been given the MCA benefits, the case of the applicant is yet to be considered. Subsequently, a further representation dated 26th November, 2020 was furnished before the respondent no. 2 which has not been considered. Thereafter, a letter dated 29th April, 2021 demanding justice was furnished before the said respondent no. 2, however, it has not been considered. Aggrieved, this application has been filed.

It is submitted by Mrs. B. Ghoshal, learned advocate for the applicant since the applicant is entitled to MCA benefits under the law, appropriate order may be passed directing the respondent to grant the same at the earliest.

Mr. G.P. Banerjee, learned advocate for the State respondents submits that if directed, the respondents will consider the matter in accordance with law.

Having heard the learned advocates for the parties and considering the facts and circumstances of the case, the application is disposed of by directing the Inspector General and Commissioner of Stamp Revenue, the respondent no. 2 to dispose of the representations dated 24th August, 2020 and 26th November, 2020 by passing a reasoned order with regard to the grant of MCA
