In this application, Amiya Pan son of Late Sudhir Pan has prayed for certain reliefs, relevant portion is as under :-

a)"An order do issue directing the concerned respondent authorities to forthwith disburse the arrear family pension and regular family pension in favour of the applicant herein being the 70% disabled married son of the deceased employee in accordance with law and within a stipulated time period taking into account the provisions of Rule 104 A of the West Bengal Services (Death-cum-Retirement Benefits) Rules, 1971."

Heard both the learned advocates.

During the perusal of the records, it appears that at page 17, the crucial document attached by the applicant regarding the Medical Board declaring the applicant as physically disabled dated 31.01.2002 is not very legible. Learned advocate for the applicant agrees that in the next date he will produce the original certificate.

In a communication dated 01.02.2016 the Office of the Principal Accountant General (A & E), W.B., had asked for submission of the Service Book of the deceased employee either in original or, if lost, a reconstructed one.

Learned advocate for the state was reminded of this action and in the next date he will submit the status of the Service Book. Let the matter appear under the heading "Hearing" on **29.07.2022**.
