The matter is taken up by the Single Bench pursuant to the order contained in the Notification No. 638-WBAT/2J-15/2016 (Pt.-II) dated 23<sup>rd</sup> November, 2022 issued in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 5(6) of the Administrative Tribunals Act, 1985.

On consent of the learned counsel, the case is taken up for consideration sitting singly.

Affidavit of service filed be kept on record.

The prayer in this application is for setting aside the appointment issued in favour of the Private Respondent No. 7, Samim Molla for the post of Revenue Officer presently posted as Revenue Inspector at Goghat-2, Hooghly District. The applicant claims to be a School Teacher and presently posted at Itahar Girls High School, Uttar Dianjpur. Interestingly, as submitted by the learned counsel for the applicant and as mentioned in the application, the applicant is the wife of the Private Respondent No. 7, Samim Molla. However, the purported appointment letter in favour of the Private Respondent as a Revenue Officer has not been submitted in this application. On being enquired, Ms. A. Shaw, learned counsel for the applicant states that she does not have copies of such appointment letter issued in favour of her husband, the Private Respondent No. 7. Further, on being asked on what ground this appointment of her husband, the Private Respondent is being challenged, Ms. Shaw submits that the Private Respondent though her husband was in Judicial Custody for thirty (30) days being involved in a criminal case.

It reveals from a copy of her applicant's letter to the Registrar of Co-operative Assistant that there was clear indication of marital discord and she had filed a complaint before the Raiganj Women Police Station.

After hearing the submissions of the learned counsels and considering the documents in this application, the Tribunal has come to this findings that such an application filed by a private citizen is not admissible in this Tribunal.

In view of the above observation, this application is **disposed of** without any orders for lack of determination.
