Mr. Mukherjee has stated in his application for review of the order dated 04.04.2022 that “there was a delay of more than 12 (twelve) years in filing the OA-13 of 2019 which is false and unacceptable for the reasons discussed in earlier paragraphs.”

In the order dated 04.04.2022, the Tribunal had rejected the prayer for condonation of delay for twelve years for approaching the Tribunal since the death of the employee on 20.02.2007. It was an order based on the simple fact that the applicant took twelve years to approach the Tribunal for compassionate appointment.

During the submission for review of the order dated 04.04.2022, Mr. Mukherjee has failed to satisfy the Court why the order was issued with casual approach.

On the other hand, Mr. Ghosh has quoted the relevant sections of the CPC and the Tribunal's Act to support his contention that this application for review of the Tribunal's order is not maintainable under law. Therefore, this may be refused.

Having heard both the learned advocates, I am of
