A copy of said P.P.O. is kept on record.

Mr. Basu, Learned Counsel representing the contemnor/respondent no. 7 submits that the applicant could not produce proper documents before the respondent no. 7 in time for issuance of the certificate as directed by the Tribunal. He further submits that initially the applicant submitted one certificate from M.L.A. and another certificate from the local Councillor, which were not accepted by the respondent A.G., W.B. He further submits that the respondent no. 7 issued a certificate as soon as the applicant produced an affidavit sworn before Notary.

We have also heard Learned Counsel representing the applicant who submits that payment of arrears of family pension is not done, but the same is beyond the scope and ambit of the order passed by the Tribunal in the original application.
