Therefore, he could not appear before this Tribunal. Thereafter, the file of instant case was misplaced. Therefore, restoration application could not be made by the applicant within time. Thus the delay for 226 days, which is not intentional one, be condoned and the instant MA be allowed by condoning the delay of filing of the MA 147 of 2016. The MAs have been filed praying for recalling of the order dated 11.01.2016 and restoration of the MA 7 of 2015 respectively. *Heard the applicant and perused* the records. It is noted that after going through the compliance report and being satisfied, this Tribunal had dropped the contempt petition in presence of both the parties i.e. Mr. R. A. Chowdhury, the Counsel for the petitioner and Mr. S. N. Roy, the Counsel for the contemnor. 	onwards till 11.01.2016, when this Tribunal			
	dismissed the application for default for non
