	the authority to grant compassionate appointment in	
	favour of the applicant No.2 as the father of the	
	applicant No.2 died on 25.01.2011. According to the	
	applicants, thereafter, the applicant no.1 made a	
	representation before the Director of Health Services	
	on 12.09.11 (Annexure-B) and thereafter on	
	16.05.16 (Annexure-D) followed by another	
	representation dated 06.02.17 (Annexure-E). As	
	they did not get any response from the authority	
	being aggrieved they filed the instant original	
	application.	
	We have perused the records as well as	
	documents filed by the applicants and we find that	
	there is no receipt of representation dated 12.09.11.	
	However, the representation dated 16.05.16 was	
	received by the authority on that date.	
	Subsequently, representation dated 25.01.17 sent	
	through speed post dated 06.02.17.	
	It is well settled principles of law that	
	repeated representations cannot keep alive the	
	limitation and from the perusal of the documents, it	
	transpires that representation dated 12.09.11, there	
	is no receipt of the representation dated 12.09.2011.	
	Thus, he had submitted first representation in the	
	year 2016 only. Therefore, the application is also	
	hopelessly barred by limitation, as the main
