	The applicant has prayed for direction upon	
	the respondents to release pension and other	
	retirement benefits in favour of the applicant.	
	The applicant claims to have joined in the post	
	of Night Guard on April 18, 1996 and retired from the	
	said post on May 31, 2006. The applicant previously	
	moved the Tribunal by filing OA 453 of 2011 which	
	was disposed of on January 24, 2012. On January	
	24, 2012, the Tribunal gave direction to the	
	respondents to consider whether the applicant is	
	entitled to get pension and pensionary benefits and	
	to communicate the same to the respondent A.G.,	
	W.B. within specific period of time. It appears from	
	the original pension file of the applicant maintained	
	by the respondent A.G., W.B that the date of joining	
	of the applicant in the post of Night Guard was on	
	May 1, 1997. Mr. Mitra, the departmental	

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representative of respondent A.G., W.B submits that
the applicant is not entitled to get pension for not
rendering 10 years of service as per provisions of
Rule 67 of West Bengal Services (Death – cum –
Retirement Benefit) Rules 1971 (herein after referred
to as DCRB Rules, 1971).

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Learned Counsel representing the applicant has placed on record the order dated April 9, 1996 issued by the Superintending Engineer (I) Kangsabati Circle, Bankura and submitted that the applicant was appointed in the post of Night Guard under Work-charged Establishment with effect from April 18, 1996. She further submits that the applicant has completed 10 years of qualifying service for pension, but the applicant is deprived of the pension in spite of specific order in this regard by the Tribunal on January 24, 2012 in OA 453 of 2011.

On consideration of the materials on record, we find that the applicant has received Rs. 47, 575/- as Gratuity by A/c Payee cheque dated December 28, 2012. The question which calls for determination is whether the applicant is entitled to get pension as per provisions of Rule 67 of the DCRB Rules, 1971. The entries made in the copy of the Service Book of the applicant (Annexure A to the original application) indicate that the applicant was appointed in the post

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	of Night Guard under Work-charged Establishment	
	with effect from April 18, 1996. It further appears	
	from the Service Book that the applicant was	
	absorbed in the Regular Establishment with effect	
	from July 1, 1998. It is not clear to us how the	
	respondent no. 4 communicated to the respondent	
	A.G., W.B. that the applicant was appointed on	
	May1, 1997, particularly when the documents in	
	support of the appointment of the applicant in the	
	post of Night Guard clearly indicate that the applicant	
	was initially appointed in the post of Night Guard	
	under Work-charged Establishment on April 18,	
	1996 and subsequently absorbed in the Regular	
	Establishment on July 1, 1998. In the absence of any	
	supporting document, we are unable to accept the	
	date of joining of the applicant on May 1, 1997 as	
	disclosed in the letter issued by the respondent no.4	
	in favour of the respondent A.G., W.B. In view of our	
	above observation, we can safely hold that the	
	applicant joined in the post of Night Guard in the	
	specific pay scale on April 18, 1996 under Work-	
	charged Establishment and he was absorbed in the	
	Regular Establishment with effect from July 1, 1998.	
	There is nothing on record to indicate that there	
	was any break in continuous service of the applicant	

from the period of initial appointment under Work-

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	charged Establishment till the date of absorption in		
	the Regular Establishment. Since the applicant was		
	appointed as Night Guard under Work-charged		
	Establishment on April 18, 1996 and worked continuously till his absorption in the Regular		
	Establishment on July 1, 1998, we are of the view		
	that the period of service of the applicant from April		
	18, 1996 to July 1, 1998 should be counted for		
	computation of qualifying service for pension as per		
	provisions Rule 67 of the DCRB Rules, 1971. Thus on		
	mathematical calculation of the period of service of		
	the applicant from April 1, 1996 till May 31, 2006, we		
	are of the view that the applicant has fulfilled the		
	criteria for qualifying service of pension and thereby		
	the applicant is entitled to get pension as laid down		
	in Rule 67 of the DCRB Rules, 1971.		
	Accordingly, respondent no. 4, the Executive		
	Engineer, Kangsabati Canals, Division II is directed		
	to take necessary steps for sanction of pension of the		

Engineer, Kangsabati Canals, Division II is directed to take necessary steps for sanction of pension of the applicant within a period of twelve weeks from the date of communication of the order and intimate the result of the same to the applicant within a period of two weeks thereafter.

With the above direction, the original

application is **disposed of**.
