Thouah the applicant has referred the case of Mr. Tapan Barman but mere listing of name in a common panel does not prove that the said Tapan Barman made the first application beyond the stipulated period of time. Moreover, as per the counsel for the applicant his case was rejected as per Emp-251 of 2013. However, his father died in 2002 only. The counsel for the respondent has further submitted that even in 2013 circular, it has been categorically stated that all the pending case would be considered. Therefore, the respondent has rightly rejected the claim of the applicant. We have heard both the parties and perused It is noted that the claim of the the records. applicant for compassionate appointment has been rejected with the following observations; 14(a) of the Labour "5. Clause Department's notification No.251-Emp., dated 03.12.2013 states that the application submitted more than two years after death/incapacitation prior to issue of Notification No.30-Emp., dated 02.04.2008 will not be entertained. If no application is submitted within the said period, it will be presumed that the family does not require any financial assistance. 6. It appears that Shri Nilratan Barman had applied for the first time for compassionate appointment on 30.08.2007, which is almost five years later from the date of death of Late Kandura Barman. The petitioner could not produce any other document in support of his claim prior to No document has been 30.08.2007. produced in support of his mother's claim also. 7. Ld. Advocate of the petitioner argued that the present case is similar with the case of Shri Tapan Barman (O.A.No.412 of 2011). But in the matter of Tapan Barman vs. State of West Bengal & Ors., Hon'ble West Bengal Administrative Tribunal in its Order dated 03.02.2015 observed that the petitioner filed an application praying for job on

In view of the above, it is clear that the respondent had dealt with the case of the applicant after considering all the issues as submitted by the applicant presently. Further, the main reason for rejecting the claim of the applicant is nonsubmission of application within proper time and it is also observed that applicant has not enclosed any documents to prove his claim that he had filed the application within a stipulated period of time. In view of the above, we do not find any reason to entertain the application. Accordingly, the application is **dismissed** being devoid of merit with no order as to cost. P.
