	The applicant has prayed for interest on	
	delayed payment for Gratuity and commuted value of	
	pension.	
	The applicant retired from service on February	
	28, 2011. In view of re-fixation of pay of the applicant by	
	virtue of direction given by this Tribunal on September	
	19, 2013 in OA 1257 of 2012, the retirement benefits	
	were released after long delay. It appears from record	
	that the applicant received Rs,3,17,486/- as Gratuity on	
	March 04, 2014 and Rs. 3,55,751/- as commuted value of	
	pension on March 04, 2014.	
	The question for consideration of the Tribunal	
	is whether the applicant is entitled to get interest on the	
	amount of Gratuity and the amount of commuted value	
	of pension. By virtue of Memorandum No. 9112-F dated	
	September 24, 1979 issued by the Secretary to the	
	Government of West Bengal, Finance Department, Audit

	entitled to get interest on Gratuity at the rate of 5 per	
	cent per annum for the period beyond three months	
	when the gratuity becomes due till the end of the	
	preceding month on which payment was actually made, if	
	there was no lapse on the part of the applicant. In the	
	instant case, there is nothing on record to indicate that	
	there was any lapse on the part of the applicant and as	
	such, the delay cannot be attributed to the conduct of	
	the applicant. So, the applicant is entitled to get interest	
	on the amount of gratuity as observed herein above. On	
	the same analogy the applicant is entitled to get interest	
	at the same rate on commuted value of pension.	
	In view of our above findings, the Respondent	
	No. 3, Block Development Officer, Panskura-I	
	Development Block is directed to make payment of	
	interest to the applicant at the rate of 5 per cent per	
	annum on the amount of Rs, 3,17,486/- (Gratuity) and on	
	the amount of Rs, 3,55,751/- (commuted value of	
	pension) for the period from June 01, 2011 to February	
	28, 2014 within a period of twelve weeks from the date
