of 10 years in Government employment in terms of Rule 67 of West Bengal Services (Death-cum Retirement Benefits) Rules, 1971 (In short, D.C.R.B. Rules, 1971). Having heard Learned Counsel for the applicant, the departmental representative of the state respondents and the departmental representative of the respondents A.G. W.B, we find that the service rendered by the applicant during the period from 1974 to 1984 was service of a seasonal worker and the said employment came to an end long before appointment of the applicant in Group D post in the year 2017. Naturally, the applicant is not entitled to get any benefit of past service rendered by him as a seasonal worker during the period from 1974 to 1984. However, the service rendered by the applicant in the Group D post for total period of 9 years 8 months and 8 days. The State Government can condone the short fall of less than 6 months in qualifying service for grant of pension by invoking of provisions of Rule 36 read with Rule 4 of West Bengal Services (Death-cum Retirement Benefits) Rules, 1971. In our view, this is a fit case whether deficiency in qualifying service for grant of pension should be condoned by relaxation of provisions of DCRB Rules and by invoking for provisions of Rules 36 of the DCRB Rules, 1971.

Under the above circumstances, we direct the respondent no. 1, Principal Secretary to the Government
