	The instant application has been filed mainly praying for compassionate appointment. According to the applicant, his father died on 07.01.2001 leaving behind his widow, three daughters and one son. Thereafter, the applicant's sister Smt. Kalomoni Murmu made an application on 26.02.2001 and at that time the applicant was minor. However, the said application was not considered. Thereafter, since the sister got married, the applicant, after attaining the majority, made an application for compassionate appointment on 29.08.2006 (Annexure C). However, according to the applicant till date his prayer has not been considered. Being aggrieved with, he has filed the instant application. It is noted that the application is hopelessly barred by limitation since the father died in 2001 and though thereafter the sister of the applicant applied for compassionate appointment. 	the authority in 2006. However, according to the	
	applicant this case was not considered by the	
	authority and he has filed the instant application in	
	2017. According to the counsel for the applicant, it	
	was a continuous cause of action since the case is	
	pending before the authority. From the above, it is	
	crystal clear that the cause of action arose in 2001.	
	Even if we have to accept the contention of the	
	applicant that after attaining the majority, the	
	applicant approached the authority in 2006, even	
	then he has approached this Tribunal after 11	
	years. Therefore, as per Section 21 of the	
	Administrative Tribunal Act 1985, the application is	
	hopelessly barred by limitation. Even, no such	
	application for condonation of delay has been filed.	
	No cogent reason has been shown for such delay	
	except making the submission that this is a	
	continuous cause of action. Therefore, we are	
	unable to entertain the OA being hopelessly barred	
	by limitation. Accordingly, OA is dismissed.
