Ghosh, learned advocate for the respondent submits that the memo dated 29th August 2016, under challenge, issued by the Director of Health Services & Ex-Officio Secretary, Department of Health & Family Welfare, West Bengal, is just and proper. In this application, the applicant has challenged the memo dated 29th August 2016, issued by the Director of Health Services & Ex-Officio Secretary, Department of Health & Family Welfare, West Bengal, appearing at page 16 of this application, which is as under: "Sub: Regarding Voluntary Retirement. The undersigned is hereby directed to inform you that your prayer for Voluntary Retirement is not tenable as per Rule (75 aaaa) of WBSR Part-I." It is apparent from the order under challenge that it is without any reason and order has been passed Therefore, the order under challenge mechanically. cannot be sustained and hence, it is set aside and quashed.
