Advocate.</i></p> <p><i>The applicant has prayed for direction upon the respondents to comply with the order dated May 19, 2011 passed by this Tribunal in OA-446/2005.</i></p> <p><i>None appears on behalf of the applicant on call. This matter is pending for adjudication before the Tribunal from November 17, 2014 and as such we are inclined to dispose of the present application on merit in terms of Rule 16 of West Bengal Administrative Tribunal (Procedure) Rule, 1994. We have heard Learned Counsel for the state respondents, who submits that all retirement benefits have already been disbursed in favour of the applicant in terms of the direction given by the Tribunal in OA-446/2005.</i></p> <p><i>It appears from the materials on record that the applicant approached the Tribunal previously by filing OA-446/2005 praying for disbursement of the retiral benefits and the amount of General Provident Fund and Group Insurance to which the applicant was entitled. On May 19, 2011 this Tribunal disposed of OA-446/2005 by making observation that the applicant is not entitled to get</i></p>

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Csm	<p><i>either Gratuity or Pension as he was dismissed from service. The Tribunal also observed that an amount of Rs. 79,000/- has already been received by the applicant on account of General Provident Fund. The only dues of the applicant was an amount of Group Insurance which was directed to be paid to the applicant within a period of 8 (eight) weeks by the Tribunal in OA-446/2005. It appears from the reply submitted by the state respondents that an amount of Rs. 2,701/- has already been disbursed in favour of the applicant under the heading Group Insurance. So, the applicant is not entitled to get any other benefits in compliance with the order passed by the Tribunal on May 19, 2011 in OA-446/2005.
