	The applicant has prayed for direction upon the	
	respondents to grant her half share of the amount of	
	General Provident Fund and all other service benefits of	
	her deceased mother, Smt Lakshmi Saha.	
	It appears from the materials on record that one	
	Smt Lakshmi Saha, wife of Late Nemai Chandra Saha	
	was appointed as Warder in Presidency Correctional	
	Home, Alipore on October 13, 1987. She died on March	
	27, 2011 leaving behind her daughter, the applicant	
	Smt Mitali Das (Saha) and son, the respondent No. 5 -	
	Amitava Saha alias Debasish Saha as legal heirs. The

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contention of the applicant Smt Mitali Das is that she is
entitled to get the half share of Gratuity of her deceased
mother and also the amount of G.P.F. and Group
Insurance of her deceased mother. The Respondent No.
5 – Amitava Saha alias Debasish Saha is contesting the
case by filing a reply. Learned Counsel representing the
Respondent No. 5 submits that the Respondent No. 5 is
not claiming the full share of G.P.F. and Group
Insurance, but he is entitled to get the entire amount of

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Having heard Learned Counsel representing both parties and on consideration of the materials on record, we are of the view that the applicant being the married daughter is not entitled to get any share in the amount of Gratuity of her deceased mother as per provisions of Rule 7 (1)(e)(1) of West Bengal Services (Death-cum-Retirement Benefit) Rules, 1971, particularly when the marriage of the applicant took place before the death of her mother. The Status Report submitted on behalf of the A.G., W.B. indicates that a sum of Rs. 4,72,080/-has already been paid to the Respondent No. 5 as Death Gratuity of Smt. Lakshmi Saha. However, the applicant is entitled to get both the amount of G.P.F. and the amount of Group Insurance along with Respondent No. 5 in equal half share. Since the

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applicant and the respondent no. 5 have not yet
submitted application in the prescribed format for
release of the amount of G.P.F. and Group Insurance,
the authority concerned was not in a position to
disburse the amount of G.P.F. and Group Insurance.

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Under the above circumstances, the applicant and the respondent no. 5 are directed to submit application the prescribed format by giving necessary information for release of the amount of G.P.F. and the amount of Group Insurance before the Respondent No. Superintendent, Presidency Correctional Home, Alipore within a period of 4 (four) weeks from this date. If such application and information are furnished by both the applicant and the respondent no. 5 within the stipulated period of time, the Respondent No. 2, Superintendent, Presidency Correctional Home, Alipore will take necessary steps for release of the amount of G.P.F. and the amount of Group Insurance in favour of the applicant and the Respondent No. 5 in equal half share as legal heirs of the deceased Smt Lakshmi Saha within a period of 12 (twelve) weeks from the date of submission of the application in the prescribed format by the applicant and the respondent no. 5.

With the above direction the original application
