	entitled to unrevised scale no. 18 on and from April	
	01, 1999 for completion of 20 years of service. Mr.	
	S.N. Ray, Learned Counsel for the applicant contends	
	that pay scale of the applicant was reduced by	
	imposition of punishment in a disciplinary proceeding	
	started against the applicant while he was in service.	
	Mr. Ray has urged this Bench to consider that the	
	applicant was not in a position to pray for granting	
	him unrevised scale no. 18 till date of quashing of the	
	punishment imposed on the applicant by the	
	disciplinary authority by this Tribunal on December	
	12, 2006 when OA-1501/2003 filed by the applicant	
	was disposed of.	
	The applicant could have prayed for granting	
	him unrevised scale no. 18 when the applicant	
	prayed for quashing of the order of punishment	
	imposed by the disciplinary authority by filing OA-	
	1501/2003. The prayer for granting unrevised scale	
	no. 18 to the applicant is, no doubt, consequential	
	relief of quashing of order of punishment prayed by	
	the applicant before the Tribunal in OA-1501/2003.	
	Accordingly, we are unable to accept the contention	
	made on behalf of the applicant that the applicant	
	could not pray for granting him unrevised scale no.

	that the applicant has not placed on record the order	
	passed by the Tribunal on December 12, 2006 in OA-	
	1501/2003 by quashing the order of punishment	
	imposed by the disciplinary authority of the	
	applicant.	
	Admittedly, the applicant retired from service on	
	September 30, 2002 and the cause of action for	
	granting him benefit of unrevised scale no. 18 arose	
	on April 01, 1999. Even assuming of argument's sake	
	that the said cause of action is continuing cause of	
	action till the date of retirement of the applicant on	
	September 30, 2002, the said continuing cause of	
	action came to a halt on the retirement of the	
	applicant from service on September 30, 2002. We	
	have already observed that the applicant could have	
	prayed for granting him benefit of unrevised scale no.	
	18 when the applicant prayed for quashing of the	
	order of punishment imposed by the disciplinary	
	authority by filing OA-1501/2003 which was	
	disposed of on December 12, 2006. No cogent	
	explanation is forthcoming before us as to why the	
	applicant did not pray for granting him benefit of	
	unrevised scale no. 18 in OA-1501/2003. The issue

	could have been urged by the applicant in OA-	
	1501/2003, but the said issue was not raised as	
	contended on behalf of the applicant, and as such the	
	said issue cannot be raised in the present original	
	application being barred by Principles of constructive	
	res-judicata.	
	The admitted position is that the present original	
	application was filed by the applicant on February	
	18, 2011. The order of imposition of punishment on	
	the applicant by the disciplinary authority by	
	reduction of pay scale was quashed by the Tribunal	
	on December 12, 2006 in OA-1501/2003. No cogent	
	explanation is forthcoming as to why the applicant	
	did not approach the Tribunal after his retirement on	
	September 30, 2002 and even after disposal of OA-	
	1501/2003. The explanation put forward by the	
	applicant for the inordinate delay in filing the original	
	application to the effect that the applicant had to wait	
	till his prayer for granting him unrevised scale no. 18	
	was communicated to the applicant by the Joint	
	Secretary and OSD to the Government of West	
	Bengal, Department of Personnel and Administrative	
	Reforms on April 20, 2009 is not acceptable to us, as

	long back without waiting for the response from the		
	Joint Secretary to the Government of West Bengal,		
	Department of Personnel and Administrative		
	Reforms. In view of our above findings, we are		
	constrained to hold that the applicant has miserably		
	failed to explain the inordinate delay of almost nine		
	(09) years in approaching the Tribunal for grant of		
	unrevised scale no. 18. In our view, the original		
	application is clearly barred u/s 21 of the		
	Administrative Tribunals Act, 1985.		
	In view of our above observation, we cannot		
	persuade ourselves to go into the merit of the original		
	application. As a result, the original application is		
	<b>dismissed</b> and the application filed u/s 21(3) of the		
	Administrative Tribunal's Act, 1985 is also		
	dismissed.
