	The original applicant joined in the government	
	service as Sub-Assistant Engineer under Directorate	
	of Irrigation and Waterways on May 11, 1977. He	
	was appointed to the post of Assistant Engineer	
	under the Directorate of Irrigation and Waterways	
	on June 22, 1978. He did not get any promotion to	
	the post of Executive Engineer till the date of his	
	retirement from service on January 31, 2008.	
	Previously, the original applicant approached this	
	Tribunal by filing OA-473 of 2015 praying for	
	direction upon the Secretary to the Government of	
	West Bengal, Department of Irrigation and	
	Waterways to act upon the letter issued by the

	On November 18, 2015, this Tribunal disposed of	
	OA-473 of 2015 by directing the Departmental	
	Secretary of the Department of Irrigation and	
	Waterways to act upon the letter dated September	
	25, 2014 issued by the Director of Personnel and	
	Ex-Officio Chief Engineer within specific period of	
	time. As a result, the Secretary to the Government	
	of West Bengal, Department of Irrigation and	
	Waterways has passed a reasoned order after giving	
	the applicant an opportunity of hearing on January	
	19, 2016, which is under challenge in the present	
	application. The applicants have now prayed for	
	direction upon the respondents for granting benefit	
	of service of Executive Engineer in favour of the	
	original applicant after setting aside the impugned	
	order dated January 19, 2016 issued by the	
	Respondent No. 1 i.e. Secretary to the Government	
	of West Bengal, Department of Irrigation and	
	Waterways.	
	Learned Counsel for the applicant has made	
	two fold submissions before us: first, that the	
	original applicant has been discriminated by not

	secondly, that the length of service of the original	
	applicant should be extended by three years for	
	getting retirement benefits in terms of the provisions	
	of Rule 27 of the West Bengal Services (Death-cum-	
	Retirement Benefits) Rules, 1971 (in short, the	
	D.C.R.B. Rules, 1971)modified by Memorandum	
	dated June 8, 1998 issued by the Deputy Secretary

	the original applicant being only a Graduate	
	Engineer who was recruited as Assistant Engineer	
	in the Directorate of Irrigation and Waterways, is	
	not entitled to get benefit of extension of length of	
	service by three years in terms of the modified	
	provisions of Rule 27 of the D.C.R.B. Rules, 1971. It	
	is also contended on behalf of the state respondents	
	that the reasoned order passed by the Secretary to	
	the Government of West Bengal, Department of	
	Irrigation and Waterways is justified under the law.	
	Having heard Learned Counsel representing	
	both parties and on consideration of the materials	
	on record, we find that the original applicant worked	
	as Assistant Engineer under Directorate of Irrigation	
	and Waterways w.e.f. June 22, 1978 till the date of	
	his retirement on June 31, 2008. The admitted	
	position is that the original applicant could not clear	
	all the papers in professional and departmental	
	examination and thereby he was not confirmed in	
	the post of Assistant Engineer till the date of his	
	retirement from service in terms of the provisions of	
	Ruke 4(1)(a) & (b) of West Bengal Services	
	(Appointment, Probation and Confirmation) Rules,	
	1979 read with Rules 12 & 13 of Chapter II(A) and	
	Rule 1(vii) of Chapter I of West Bengal Services

	pertinent to point out that the original applicant has	
	candidly admitted in paragraph 6 (c) of the original	
	application that he did not pass Hindi I paper of	
	Departmental and Professional examination in	
	terms of the provisions of West Bengal Services	
	(Training and Examination) Rules, 1953. Since the	
	original applicant was not confirmed in the post of	
	Assistant Engineer for not passing all the papers in	
	Departmental and Professional examination in	
	terms of the provisions of West Bengal Services	
	(Training and Examination) Rules, 1953 and the	
	provisions of West Bengal Services (Appointment,	
	Probation and Configuration) Rules, 1979, the	
	original applicant cannot claim to get promotion to	
	the post of Executive Engineer in the Directorate of	
	Irrigation and Waterways. It transpires from the	
	materials on record that the original applicant was	
	asked to remain in charge of the office of the	
	Executive Engineer of Kangsabati Mechanical	
	Division from December 1985 to January 1989 in	
	addition to his normal duty and as such his posting	
	in the cadre of Executive Engineer can never be	
	construed as his promotion. The Secretary to the	
	Government of West Bengal, Department of	
	Irrigation and Waterways has categorically observed

	Executive Engineer for not passing all the papers in	
	the Departmental and Professional examination in	
	terms of the provisions of West Bengal Services	
	(Training and Examination) Rules, 1953,	
	particularly when he was not confirmed even in the	
	post of Assistant Engineer of the Directorate of	
	Irrigation and Waterways in terms of the provisions	
	of West Bengal Services (Appointment, Probation	
	and Configuration) Rules, 1979.	
	With regard to the claim of the original	
	applicant to get benefit of counting of length of	
	service by three years in terms of the provisions of	
	Rule 27 of the D.C.R.B. Rules as modified by	
	Memorandum issued by the Deputy Secretary to the

	Pension Branch on June 08, 1998, we would like to	
	observe that Rule 27 of the D.C.R.B. Rules, 1971	
	can be invoked by a government employee for	
	getting benefit of length of service by three years	
	(which was previously five years before	
	enhancement of retirement age of the government	
	employee upto 60 years), if the post in which the	
	government employee is appointed requires	
	minimum educational qualification of Post Graduate

	Research or any other specific qualification or	
	experience in Scientific or Technical or Professional	
	field and the normal age of recruitment to the said	
	post is above 25 years of age. The posts or services	
	for which the provisions of Rule 27 of the D.C.R.B.	
	Rules, 1971 are applicable are enumerated in	
	Appendix IV and Appendix V of the D.C.R.B. Rules,	
	1971. On close scrutiny of both Appendix IV and	
	Appendix V of the D.C.R.B. Rules, 1971, we find	
	that the post of Assistant Engineer and the post of	
	Executive Engineer under Directorate of Irrigation	
	and Waterways are conspicuously absent from the	
	said appendices. The additional scientific	
	qualification or technical qualification or post	
	graduate qualification is not required for	
	recruitment to the post of Assistant Engineer under	
	Directorate of Irrigation and Waterways and thereby	
	the benefit of extension of length of service in terms	
	of the modified provisions of Rule 27 of the D.C.R.B.	
	Rules, 1971 cannot be invoked in the case of the	
	original applicant.	
	With regard to the allegation of discrimination	
	of the original applicant with D.G.P. Mukherjee and	
	S. Dasgupta, we would like to observe that the	
	allegation of discrimination has not been	
	substantiated by producing documents to establish
