	writ petition before the High Court, being C.O 13254 (w)			
	of 1993, Balai Chakraborty –vs- Superintendent of Police,

	immediate steps for providing employment to the			
	applicant on the basis of his being successful in the			
	selection for the post of constable in the district of			
	Murshidabad. Aggrieved, the State preferred appeal,			
	being F.M.A.T. 3984 of 1997, which was dismissed for			
	default on 14 th February, 2002. It appears that the State
