	present applicant Soumi Mondal submitted informal	
	application on August 19, 2013 praying for	
	compassionate appointment as one of the dependent	
	members of the family of the deceased employee.	
	Subsequently, on October 25, 2013, the applicant	
	submitted formal application for compassionate	
	appointment along with all necessary documents	
	including no objection from other legal heirs in the form

	fact was communicated to the applicant under letter	
	dated March 11, 2015 (Annexure G to the original	
	application).	
	Learned Counsel for the applicant submits that	
	the prayer of the applicant for compassionate	
	appointment was rejected as the income of the family of	
	the deceased employee exceeded 180% of last gross pay	
	drawn by the deceased employee, which is not justified.	
	According to Learned Counsel, the breakup of income of	
	the family of the deceased employee is not disclosed in	
	the letter dated March 11, 2015.	
	None appears on behalf of the State Respondents.	
	No report has been submitted on behalf of the State	
	Respondents in compliance with the direction given by	
	the Tribunal.	
	The question for consideration of the Tribunal is	
	whether prayer of the applicant for compassionate	
	appointment was rejected in an arbitrary and illegal

	submitted by the applicant, we find that the applicant	
	has disclosed that her mother and she have been living	
	with family and the mother was earning Rs. 33,704/- as	
	Government employee at the time of death of the father	
	of the applicant. The contents of formal application also	
	disclose that the mother of the applicant was getting	
	Rs. 9,505/- per month as family pension in addition to	
	her monthly salary of Rs. 33,704/- and interest on the	
	retirement benefits like Rs. 5,40,000/- as G.P.F., Rs.40,000	
	as Group Insurance, Rs.2,83,440/- as leave encashment	
	and Rs. 6,00,000/- as Death Gratuity. On consideration of	
	the income of the family of the deceased employee as	
	disclosed in the formal application by the applicant, we	
	are constrained to hold that there was no acute financial	
	crisis in the family of the deceased employee for giving	
	compassionate appointment to any dependent member	
	of the family of the said deceased employee. In view of	
	our above findings, we cannot persuade ourselves to	
	intervene in the order of rejection communicated to the	
	applicant under letter dated March 11, 2015. We do not
