	consider the representation dated 2 nd August, 2017,	
	being Annexure- 'E' to the application, pending before	
	the authority for pensionary benefit.	
	Mr.G.P.Banerjee, learned advocate for the	
	State respondents submits that though the applicant	
	did not complete the qualifying service to be eligible	
	for pension, however, if directed the respondents will	
	consider the representation in accordance with law.
