| | Mr.G.P.Banerjee, learned advocate for the State adopts the submission of Mr.Basu. Admittedly, the applicant is working with the Tripura Police and on 01.01.2018 she has crossed 31 years of age. The applicant seeks for a direction upon the respondent authorities to allow her to participate in the recruitment process for the post of Sub-Inspector/Lady Sub-Inspector (Unarmed Branch) in West Bengal Police. In our view, since the applicant has crossed 27 years of age and the upper age limit is only relaxable departmental candidates of the West Bengal Police and as she does not belong to West Bengal Police, no order cannot be passed on this application. So far the challenge to the notification is concerned, it is evident from the grounds that no valid ground has been made out for demonstrating that the notification is ultra vires Articles 14 and 21 of Constitution of India.
