	Learned Counsel representing the state respondents	
	is not able to explain to our satisfaction why the applicant	
	has been deprived of Leave Encashment for the balance	
	period of 131 days. The report submitted by the	
	respondent no. 4 indicates that the said respondent has	
	not furnished the calculation for giving credit of Earned	
	Leave to the applicant from the date of joining in the	
	service till the date of retirement and the period of Earned	
	Leave enjoyed by the applicant during the entire period of	
	service. On close scrutiny of the documents annexed to	
	the report submitted by the respondent no. 4, we find that	
	Earned Leave to the credit of the applicant during the	
	period from September 11, 1978 till the year 1991 and	
	Earned Leave to the credit of the applicant during the	
	period from 2009 to 2011 are missing from the statement	
	furnished by the respondent no. 4. Moreover, the	
	grievance of the applicant for not giving credit of 87 days	
	of Earned Leave for performance of duty as Librarian

	not been considered before finalisation of Earned Leave to
