	Leave is granted to the applicant to add	
	Principal Secretary, PWD as respondent No.1(A). As	
	per the applicant, his father died on 06.01.2015	
	while working as Mohurrior Gr.II under	
	Superintending Engineer, Western Circle, Social	
	Sector, PWD, Purba Bardhaman. Immediately after	
	the death of his father, his mother made an	
	application for compassionate appointment in his	
	favour on 04.02.2015. The applicant also	
	subsequently filed an application for compassionate	
	appointment on 08.04.2015 (Annexure P/3).	
	Thereafter, Enquiry Committee was constituted and	
	the enquiry committee vide their report dated 11 th	
	May 2016 (Annexure P/6) had recommended the	
	case of the applicant before the Competent Authority.	
	However, the Joint Secretary, Public Works	
	Department vide his order dated 21.05.2018 had	
	rejected the claim of the applicant on the ground that	
	since he is working as Civic Volunteer under the	
	Government of West Bengal, he cannot be granted	
	compassionate appointment. As per the applicant,	
	from the perusal of the calculation sheet submitted	
	by the Superintending Engineer, Western Circle,	
	Social Sector, PWD, (Annexure P/8), it would be

	evident that the total family income is less than the	
	last gross salary of the deceased employee.	
	Therefore, as per financial norms, he should be	
	considered for compassionate appointment. Further,	
	though he is working in a post of "Civic Volunteer",	
	however the post of "Civic Volunteer" is not	
	permanent employment under the State Government	
	rather this is a voluntary post. Therefore, he can be	
	terminated at any point of time or voluntarily he can	
	opt out from this voluntary job. Therefore, the	
	respondents should not treat it as an employment.	
	During the course of hearing, the counsel for	
	the respondents has also admitted that it is a	
	voluntary post and his gross income is less than the	
	gross 90% salary of the deceased employee.	
	Heard both the parties and perused the	
	records. It is an admitted fact that the post of "Civic	
	Volunteer" is a voluntary post, which cannot be	
	treated as an employment under State Government.	
	In view of the above, we quash and set aside the	
	impugned order dated 21.05.2018 and direct the	
	Principal Secretary, PWD i.e. respondent No.1A. to	
	reconsider the case of the applicant afresh and take	
	decision as per rules and communicate the same	
	within a period of eight (08) weeks from the date of	
	this order. Accordingly, the OA is disposed of with
