Government of West Bengal the option was given to the Officer of the Health Services for joining in the cadre of West Bengal Public Health-cum-Administrative Service in relaxation to Rule 3 of West Bengal Public Health –cum-Administrative Service (Option) Rules 2004. The further contention of the applicant is that the applicant exercised the option for joining in the cadre of West Bengal Public Health-cum-Administrative Service on May 02, 2012. It is also contended on behalf of the applicant that the applicant was absorbed as Medical Officer of West *Bengal Public Health-cum-Administrative Service by* Notification dated March 01, 2013 issued by the Department of Health and Family Welfare, Government of West Bengal.
