	December, 2012. It is to be noted that once the	
	application for voluntary retirement is accepted one has	
	to comply with certain formalities and to submit pension	
	papers along with relevant documents, which the	
	applicant had submitted on 4 th December, 2012. Since	
	the applicant applied for pension on 4 th December, 2012,	
	in the facts and circumstances of the case, the application	
	is disposed of by directing the Director of Health Services,	
	Government of West Bengal, respondent no. 2 (ii) to	
	grant interest at the rate of eight percent per annum on	
	the amount disbursed as mentioned in page 6 of the	
	original application on gratuity, leave encashment and	
	arrear pension to be calculated from 5 th December, 2012
