	be not interfered with. Moreover, it is submitted that as	
	transfer is a part of one's service career, no order be	
	passed on the application.	
	Heard learned advocates for the parties.	
	It is evident from paragraph 6 (viii) that the	
	applicant "was infected with covid 19 and after	
	discharge he is still suffering from acute flare of gout in	
	post covid". However, in the prayer it has been stated	
	that he was a covid patient and has not fully recovered	
	from the said disease. We find from the petition that he	
	has been released from the District Hospital, Nadia. Since	
	admittedly that the applicant was infected with covid-19	
	and after recovering was discharged, no order can be	
	passed on the application. It requires to be mentioned	
	that the Supreme Court in State of U.P and Others – Vs-	
	Gobardhan Lal (2004) 11 SCC 402, particularly in	
	paragraphs 7 and 8 thereof, has laid down the law that an	
	order of transfer, unless it is the outcome of a mala fide	
	exercise of power or violative of any statutory provision	
	or passed by an authority not competent to do so, cannot
