BLR	to pensionary benefits as resignation from service entails forfeiture of past service in terms of Rule 33 of West Bengal Service (DCRB) Rules, 1971 and there is no scope for availing any pensionary benefits from Government. Moreover, had the applicant applied before the appropriate forum earlier, matter would have been different. Since Section 21 of Administrative Tribunals Act, 1985 prescribes a period of limitation and as this application was filed on 3 rd April, 2014, that is after more than 10 years from the actual date of retirement, that is 31 st March, 2004, it is hit by the said provision. Since resignation from service is different from voluntary retirement and as voluntary retirement leads to forfeiture of past service, no order can be passed in this application.
