	The applicant has prayed for direction upon the	
	respondents for granting him benefit of Career	
	Advancement Scheme on completion of satisfactory	
	service of 16 (sixteen) years after setting aside the	
	compliance report submitted by the	
	Contemnor/Principal Secretary to the Government of	
	West Bengal, Department of Personnel & Administrative	
	Reforms in CCP No. 68/2015 arising out of OA-	
	1478/2011.	
	The applicant retired from service on March 31,	
	2009. He approached this Tribunal by filing OA-	
	1478/2011 praying for direction upon the respondents	
	to grant him benefit of Career Advancement Scheme on	
	completion of satisfactory service of 16 (sixteen) years	
	and for refixation of his pay in the pre-revised scale no.	
	18 and the consequential retirement benefits including	
	pension. The said original application was disposed of by	
	this Tribunal on April 29, 2014 by giving direction to the	
	state respondents to reconsider the case of the applicant	
	in the light of the Judgments of the Hon'ble Supreme	
	Court referred to in the Judgment of the Tribunal by

	passing a reasoned order within specific period of time.	
	The applicant filed contempt application being CCP No.	
	68/2015 alleging willful violation of the Judgment and	
	order passed by the Tribunal on April 29, 2014 in OA-	
	1478/2011. The compliance report was submitted in	
	connection with the said contempt application (CCP No.	
	68/2015) by the Principal Secretary to the Government	
	of West Bengal, Department of Personnel &	
	Administrative Reforms. On February 15, 2016 the said	
	contempt proceeding (CCP No. 68/2015) was dropped by	
	accepting the compliance report by the Tribunal.	
	With the above factual matrix, Mr. S.N. Ray,	
	Learned Counsel for the applicant contends that the	
	compliance report submitted by the Principal Secretary	
	to the Government of West Bengal, Department of	
	Personnel & Administrative Reforms in connection with	
	CCP No. 68/2015 was not in accordance with the	
	direction given by the Tribunal in OA-1478/2011. He	
	further submits that the applicant has the right to	
	ventilate his grievances before this Tribunal by filing	
	separate original application praying for the same relief	
	which was prayed before the Tribunal in OA-1478/2011	
	particularly when the applicant has prayed for	
	additional relief of setting aside the compliance report	
	submitted in connection with CCP No. 68/2015. On the	
	other hand, Mrs. Agarwal, Learned Counsel representing	
	the state respondents submits that the compliance

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	report submitted in CCP No. 68/2015 was accepted by	
	the Tribunal and as such the applicant cannot challenge	
	the said compliance report by filing the present original	
	application without any liberty granted in this regard by	
	the Tribunal. We have also heard Mr. Mitra, the	
	Departmental Representative of the Respondent A.G.,	
	W.B.	
	Having heard all the parties and on consideration	
	of the materials on record, we find that the applicant	
	previously approached the Tribunal by filing OA-	
	1478/2011 praying for grant of benefit of Career	
	Advancement Scheme on completion of 16 (sixteen)	
	years of service and for refixation of pay in the pre-	
	revised scale no. 18 and consequential enhancement of	
	retirement benefits including pension. The main	
	grievance of the applicant in the said original application	
	was that the ratings of the applicant in the Annual	
	Confidential Report (in short, A.C.R.) were not	
	communicated to him and thereby he was prejudiced for	
	denial of benefit of Career Advancement Scheme on	
	completion of 16 (sixteen) years of service and denial of	
	benefit of pre-revised scale no. 18. By Judgment and	
	order, the Tribunal disposed of OA-1478/2011 on April	
	29, 2014, whereby direction was given to the state	
	respondents to reconsider the case of the applicant for	
	granting benefit of Career Advancement Scheme in the	
	light of the decisions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court

	time. The Tribunal also gave direction to the state	
	respondents to consider grant of pre-revised scale no. 18	
	to the applicant if affirmative decision is taken after	
	reconsideration of A.C.R. of the applicant. Subsequently,	
	the applicant filed contempt application being CCP No.	
	68/2015 for non-compliance of the direction given by	
	the Tribunal in OA-1478/2011. Admittedly, the	
	compliance report was submitted by the Principal	
	Secretary to the Government of West Bengal,	
	Department of Personnel & Administrative Reforms in	
	connection with said CCP No. 68/2015 which was	
	accepted by the Tribunal, which dropped the said	
	contempt proceeding.	
	The question for consideration of the Tribunal is	
	whether the applicant has the right to challenge the said	
	compliance report submitted in CCP No. 68/2015 by	
	filing the present original application. On perusal of	
	order dated February 15, 2016 passed in CCP No.	
	68/2015, we find that the compliance report of the	
	Principal Secretary to the Government of West Bengal,	
	Department of Personnel & Administrative Reforms was	
	accepted by the Tribunal after consideration of the	
	objections raised on behalf of the applicant. It is	
	pertinent to point out that no liberty was given to the	
	applicant to challenge the said compliance report by	
	filing any subsequent original application before this

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	Tribunal. Since the Tribunal accepted the compliance	
	report after consideration of the objections raised on	
	behalf of the applicant in CCP No. 68/2015, we are	
	unable to accept the contention made by Mr. S.N. Ray,	
	Learned Counsel for the applicant that the compliance	
	report was not submitted in compliance with the	
	direction given by the Tribunal in OA-1478/2011. Had	
	the applicant been aggrieved for acceptance of the	
	compliance report by the Tribunal in CCP No. 68/2015,	
	the applicant should have ventilated his grievances by	
	challenging the order of the Tribunal before the Division	
	Bench of the Hon'ble High Court by filing appropriate	
	Writ Application. Unfortunately, Writ Application was	
	not filed by the applicant challenging the order of the	
	Tribunal by which compliance report was accepted in	
	connection with CCP No. 68/2015. Accordingly, we are	
	of the view that the order of the Tribunal by way of	
	acceptance of the compliance report in CCP No. 68/2015	
	has attained finality and the same is binding on the	
	applicant and the state respondents in the absence of	
	any liberty being granted to the applicant in the order of	
	the contempt proceeding. The applicant is also estopped	
	from challenging the said compliance report afresh by	
	filing the present original application. It will not be out of	
	place to mention that the issue of grant of benefit of	
	Career Advancement Scheme to the applicant on	
	completion of 16 (sixteen) years of service and the issue	

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I	of grant of pre-revised scale no. 18 were already	5	
	adjudicated and finally decided in OA-1478/2011 and as		
	such those issues cannot be raised again by the		
	applicant in the present original application due to		
	specific bar of the Principles of Res-Judicata.		
	On consideration of the compliance report		
	submitted by the Principal Secretary to the Government		
	of West Bengal, Department of Personnel &		
	Administrative Reforms in connection with CCP No.		
	68/2015, we find that the applicant was given		
	opportunity of hearing for reconsideration of his ratings		
	in the A.C.R. We also find that detailed reasons are given		
	as to why pre-revised scale no. 18 could not be given to		
	the applicant and why CAS benefit for completion of 16		
	(sixteen) years of service could not be given to the		
	applicant for not attaining the benchmark in the ratings		
	of the A.C.R. during the specific period.		
	In view of our above observations, we do not find		
	any merit in the present application and as such the		
	present original application is dismissed.
