	compassionate appointment. The claim of the applicant

	respondents, but ultimately the claim was rejected. The	
	said fact was communicated to the respondent No. 3 by	
	the respondent no. 2 under letter dated December 23,	
	2008. The applicant has filed the present application	
	without challenging the said impugned letter dated	
	December 23, 2008, which is now placed by the applicant	
	and the same is kept on record.

	In the instant case, the claim of the	
	applicant was rejected on the ground that the father of	
	the applicant died after completion of 22 years of service.	
	Accordingly, the claim of the applicant for compassionate	
	appointment was rightly rejected in accordance with the	
	provision of Notification No. 97-Emp dated June 06, 2005	
	issued by the Labour Department, Government of West	
	Bengal, by which the applicant is governed for	
	compassionate appointment. We do not find any merit in	
	the present application. As a result, the present	
	application is dismissed.
