	remuneration in terms of Finance Department		
	memorandum applicable to full		
	time/casual/contractual employees. On our query,		
	Mr. Neogi has failed to point out from the materials on		
	record that the applicants were engaged as full time		
	casual employees at any material point of time.		
	Relying on decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in		
	"Sabha Shanker Dube V Divisional Forest Officer and		
	Others" reported in AIR 2019 SC 220, Mr. Neogi		
	argues that the applicants are discharging duty of		
	temporary government employees and as such they		
	are entitled to get minimum basic pay of the pay-scale		
	applicable to temporary employees. On consideration		
	of the case of "Sabha Shanker Dube" (Supra) we find		
	that temporary government employees are entitled to		
	minimum of pay scale applicable to regular employees		
	working on the same post on the principle of "equal

	Shanker Dube" (Supra) has no manner of application	
	in the facts of the present case.	
	Mr. S.N. Ray , Learned Counsel representing the	
	state respondents has pointed out from the reasoned	
	order under challenge in the present application that	
	the Superintendent of Police, North 24 Parganas has	
	submitted report on December 14, 2015, December	
	29, 2015 and February 01, 2016 whereby the	
	Superintendent of Police, North 24 Parganas has	
	clearly pointed out that all the applicants are part	
	time workers and as such they are not entitled to get	
	benefit for enhancement of remuneration applicable to

	indicate whether the applicants have been working as		
	full time casual employees or part time casual		
	employees. However, the said document and the		
	particulars of each of the applicants disclosed in the		
	said document clearly point out that they were		
	engaged as casual employees on the basis of monthly		
	remuneration @ Rs. 2000/- only. No document is		
	forthcoming before us to indicate that the applicants		
	were paid more than Rs. 2000/- per month at any		
	material point of time. The said document unerringly		
	points out that the applicants were mostly engaged as		
	Sweeper or Water Carrier on the basis of monthly		
	remuneration of Rs. 2000/- in terms of Finance		
	Department Memo no. 3727-F dated May 20, 2009. In		
	view of our above observation, we are constrained to		
	hold that the reasoned order dated February 17, 2016		
	passed by the Additional Chief Secretary to the		
	Government of West Bengal, Department of Home,		
	Police Establishment Branch is legal, valid and		
	binding on the applicants.		
	Since the applicants have been working as part
