	part-time basis and did not have a necessary approval	
	either of the labour department or of the finance	
	department, no order may be passed. Submission is no

	engagement, however, was neither approved by Labour	
	Department nor by Finance Department.	
	While examining the Government Orders providing	
	continuity of the service of the part-time sweepers, it is	
	found that that the same has been provided for the	
	casual/daily-rated/contractual workers vide Finance	
	Department (Audit Branch) Memo. No. 2966-F(P) dt.	
	23.04.2010 followed by Memo. No. 9008(P) dt. 16.09.2011	
	and Memo. No. 1107-F(P) dt. 25.02.2016, but there is no	
	such provision for the part-time sweepers.	
	Whereas, the engagement of the petitioner as Part-	
	time Sweeper was neither approved by Labour Department	
	nor by Finance Department, and	
	Whereas, there is no Government Order providing	
	continuity of service of the part-time sweepers,	
	Therefore, the order for disengagement of the	
	petitioner issued by the Directorate of Employment vide	
	Memo. No. 1E-178/2016/5220-5315A dated 10.08.2017	
	cannot be set aside.	
	Accordingly, the prayer of the petitioner for his

	reinstatement as Part-time Sweeper is hereby rejected.	
	The representation of the petitioner, therefore, stands	
	disposed of."	
	Admittedly, after being approved by the	
	Director of Employment, the applicant was engaged as	
	a part-time sweeper on rotational basis. However	
	the said panel was neither approved by the labour	
	department nor by the finance department. We find	
	that the reasoned order has been passed on the basis of	
	the memo. dated 23^{rd} April, 2010, the memo. dated	
	16 th September, 2011 and the memo. dated	
	25th February, 2016 which have not been challenged in	
	the application. Moreover the finding that there is no	
	Government order providing continuity of service to	
	part-time sweepers has gone unchallenged. Therefore,	
	the Original application lacks of merit. Hence, no order	
	is passed on the application. The application is	
	dismissed.
