	In this application, the applicant an Assistant	
	Professor in the Medical College, Kolkata has challenged	
	the notification dated 20 th May, 2014 containing the	
	transfer order transferring him to Malda Medical College,	
	Malda.	
	It is submitted by Mr. G.C. Chakraborty,	
	learned advocate for the applicant that since his earlier	
	dues have not been disbursed and though he has been	
	transferred on promotion, as he has not been given the	
	actual benefit of scale of pay, therefore, the order of	
	transfer may be set aside and quashed. It is submitted	
	that the respondent authorities should have ensured	
	grant of service benefits, including arrear salary and	
	updation of service book, prior to issuance of release	
	order. Though several representations have been made,	
	no steps have been taken. It is submitted that though	
	transfer order has been issued, release order is yet to be	
	issued. Aggrieved this original application has been filed.	

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	Mr. B.P. Roy, learned advocate for the	
	respondent submits that since it is a settled position of	
	law that transfer is a part of one's service career unless it	
	is shown that the order is in violation of statutory rules or	
	is arbitrary , no order may be passed.	
	Heard Mr. Chakraborty and Mr. Roy, learned	
	advocates for the parties. It is a settled position of law	
	that transfer is a part of one's service career and it should	
	not be interfered lightly. The Supreme Court in State of	
	U.P. AND Others –Vs- Gobardhan Lal in (2004) 11 SCC 402	
	held that "It is too late in the day for any government	
	servant to contend that one appointed or posted in a	
	particular place or position, he should continue in such	
	place or position as long as he desires. Transfer of an	
	employee is not only an incident inherent in the terms of	
	appointment but also implicit as an essential condition of	
	service in the absence of any specific indication to the	
	contra, in the law governing or conditions of service.	
	Unless the order of transfer is shown to be an outcome of	
	a mala fide exercise of power or violative of any statutory	
	provision (an Act or rule) or passed by an authority not	
	competent to do so, an order of transfer cannot likely be	

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	interfered with as a matter of course or routine for any or	
	every type of grievance sought to be made" . Since in	
	the instant case the applicant has been unable to show	
	statutory rule in support of his case nor has been able to	
	demonstrate that order of transfer is malafide or the	
	authority issuing the order of transfer is not competent	
	to pass the order, and since transfer is a part of one's	
	service career, the application is dismissed. Interim order,	
	if any, is vacated. No order as to costs.
