	amount of reduced family pension after lapse of 7	
	years from the date of death of the pensioner is	
	divided in two equal shares between the applicant	
	and the respondent no.5. Mr. Mitra is not sure	
	whether the said amount of basic family pension at	
	the rate of Rs. 1485/- per month has already been	
	revised in terms of ROPA 2009. He submits that	
	family pension is revised sometimes by the	
	Treasury Officer or the Bank and sometimes by the	
	Pension Sanctioning Authority.	
	Having heard the Learned Counsel for the	
	applicant and the departmental representative of	
	respondent the A.G., West Bengal, we are of the	
	view that the applicant is entitled to get the revised	
	family pension along with respondent no.5 in equal	
	half share up to the age of 25 years of the	
	respondent no.5 in terms of the Rule 104 of West
